Interview (qualifications up to a maximum of 40/100) The oral test will consist of an oral presentation of the research proposal and a discussion of the related technical and scientific issues. Knowledge of the English language will also be tested. For this purpose, candidates may choose to make their presentation and related discussion in English.
Criteria for the evaluation	The evaluation of the Candidates is divided into two phases: the first one concerns assessable qualifications and the project proposal. Passing this step is a prerequisite for admission to the oral exam (second phase). The results of the first phase of evaluation will be published, as soon as they are available, on the University website at the link: https://www3.unimol.it/ricerca/scuola-di-dottorato/generiche/24 To be admitted to the oral exam, the candidate must report a score of not less than 30/100 (given by the sum of the evaluation of assessable qualifications and the project proposal). The maximum score achievable by each candidate is 100/100, based on the following breakdown: • 20/100 Titles • 40/100 Project evaluation attached to the application • 40/100 Oral presentation and discussion of the project attached to the application.
